

## Sharing your opportunities with the All-Wales Cancer Community

We are happy to share opportunities with our members which have the potential to positively influence the shape of cancer related policies, research priorities and activity, and cancer care provision in Wales.

We recommend that the <u>UK Standards for Public Involvement</u>, which provide very useful guidelines for planning any public involvement activities, are followed by those engaging with the AWCC.

## What we expect from you.

The members of the All-Wales Cancer Community with whom we share opportunities are giving their time and expertise, and we would expect them to be treated with respect. This includes listening to their opinions and experiences and communicating with them clearly and reliably before, during and after their involvement.

Members taking part in opportunities should know what is expected from them including:

- How much of their time will be needed;
- How their contribution is being used;
- If their contribution is no longer needed for any reason.

All our members have the opportunity to feedback to us about their experiences of taking part in opportunities, and if there are any concerns raised about how they were treated by the team in question, we would contact you to explore how we might be able to support any public involvement activities in the future.

If yours is a research-based opportunity, we expect you to have the appropriate ethical approval to recruit via the third sector.

## **Reporting expectations**

In order to maintain the All-Wales Cancer Community it is essential that we can both understand and demonstrate our impact.

To help us with this, we will request a short report of activity and outcomes following an agreed period after your engagement/involvement activity has taken place. This will also help us to avoid duplication of asks from different sources.
